Main Idea

This fall we're becoming intimately familiar with the fruit of the spirit, the elements of which are listed below. This week we'll be discussing the sixth element, goodness.

The fruit of the Spirit, goodness, is more than simply being a "nice person." In Scripture, goodness is a moral and spiritual excellence that originates from the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives. Goodness is demonstrated in how we act and reflects a heart that desires to do what is right; not for praise, honor, or recognition but because being kind honors God in serving others. Goodness combines the preceding elements of love, joy, peace, patience, and kindness.

Goodness is a virtue that shines in a dark world, not only through generosity and moral living but also standing for what is right. Goodness is active and compels us to help the hurting, defend the vulnerable, and pursue righteousness with humility. Jesus modeled perfect goodness by healing the sick, feeding the hungry, and offering salvation to sinners. As followers of Christ, we are called to reflect that same goodness in our lives as a consistent outflow of our walk with Jesus through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Questions for Consideration

1. Have you ever been around someone who is (or was) consistently good? In thinking about their lives, how would you describe them and what factors seem to contribute to the goodness they exhibit?
2. Make a list of all the factors, contributors, or reasons, either we or others lack goodness?
3. Review the Bible passages provided on the back page in some way discuss goodness. Which verse stands out most to you? Consider the Old Testament verses that speak of God's goodness.
4. Why is it sometimes difficult to practice goodness in everyday life, even when we know what's right?
5. In what specific ways can you reflect God's goodness this week in living with your family, at work, or neighborhood?
