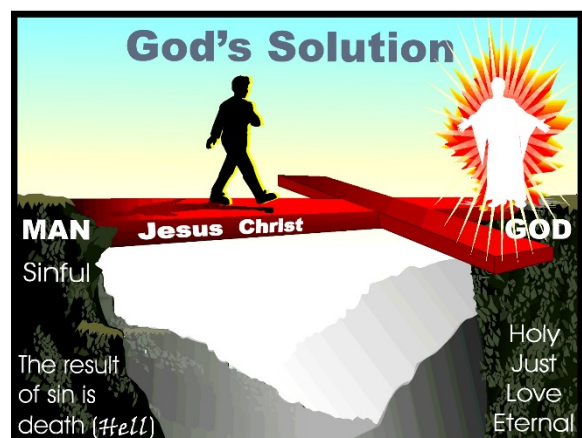
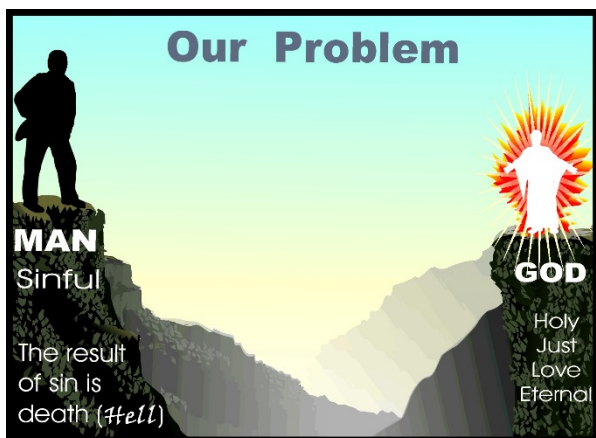

2. How does the "world" view salvation and what's required to have eternal life? Consider the average American in developing your answer. Listen to some of the 2016 statics from the Barna Group.

*Of all the subjects we'll cover in this study, I would argue **salvation** is the most important of all. What we view about salvation impacts everything we think and do. When it comes to getting eternal life, we either believe we are "good enough" or we believe we are sinners in "need of a Savior".*

- ## 3. The *Romans Road* uses passages taken from the book of Romans to help us better understand how we can have a personal relationship with God through Jesus (see graphic on Page 3).
- a. God is holy and **we are all sinners**, so we are **separated from God** (Rom. 3:23).
 - b. God is just, we all will receive the **payment we deserve**, spiritual death (or Hell) (Rom. 6:23).
 - c. God is love so He sent His Son, Jesus, to **die in our place**. (Rom. 5:8).
 - d. The eternal God showed His power by raising His Son, Jesus from the dead, and **He will forgive us and give us eternal life** if we just **trust in His Son**, Jesus. (Romans 10:9, 10; John 3:16). — *like walking across a bridge.*



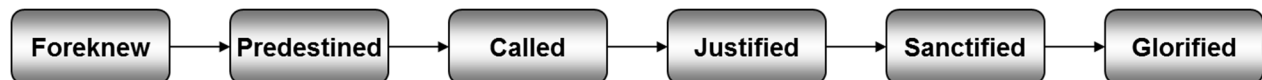
4. Most teaching on salvation does not distinguish between what can be called the “facets” (or phases) of salvation. Failing to make a distinction between these phases at best results in confusion when discussing salvation, while at worst creates a works-based salvation found among the cults.
 - a. Observe the graphic provided below and discuss what is presented.
 - b. Read the verses below and discuss how the three facets of salvation are presented.
 - i. Justification (Romans 5:1 and 8:33)
 - ii. Sanctification (2 Timothy 2:15-26)
 - iii. Glorification (John 12:12-16, Romans 8:30, 2 Thessalonians 1:3-12)

5. If you're in church long enough with people who've studied the Bible, you'll eventually get to the question – *Do we choose God or does God choose us?* While debates have raged for centuries and they will continue, I want to make sure we at least present some of the positions. The MAIN ISSUE that started the “famous” *Calvinism vs. Arminianism* debate was that of **Eternal Security**, discussed in Chapter 57 of Ryrie's text. On page 381 Ryrie states, “Basically security is based on the grace of God and the fact that eternal life is a gift and it is eternal”. Read Ephesians 2:8-9.
