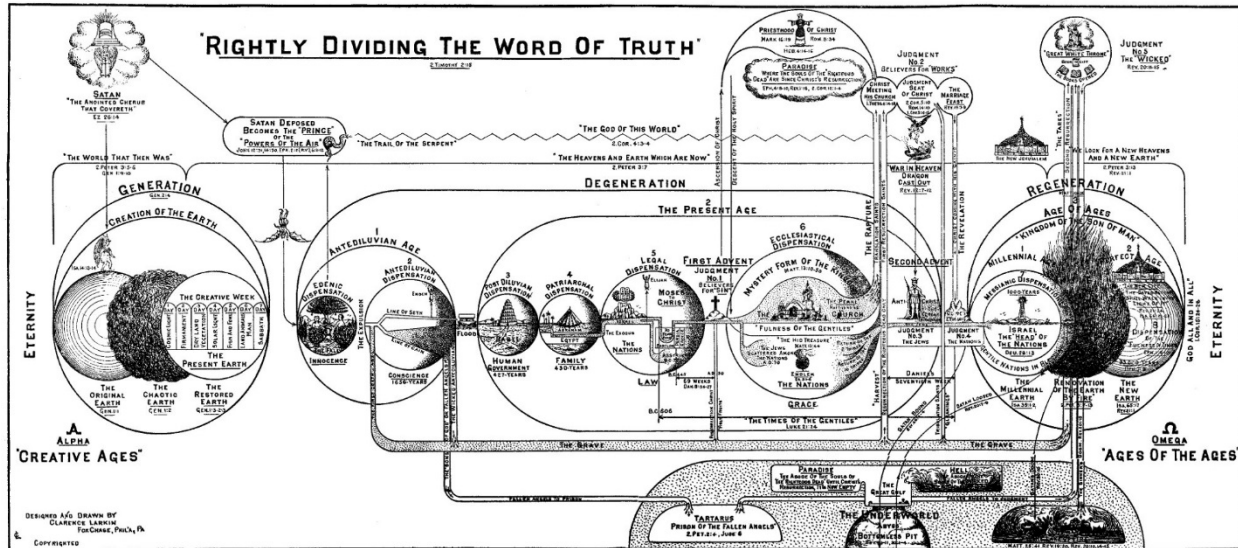


# Overview of the Bible (Lesson #5)

2. In tonight's lesson we'll cover topics taken from Chapters 22-25 of *Basic Theology* that discuss *Our Adversary the Devil*. What are some of the common thoughts from the general population on the Devil, or Satan?
3. Ironically, there are few passages in the Bible that identify Satan's origins. Ezekiel 28 is a text that's commonly used to provide some useful background. Let's read Ezekiel 28:1-19 and identify some of the attributes ascribed to Satan (specifically in reading verses 11-19).
4. Also read Isaiah 14:12-17? What other "nuggets" of information do we glean from this passage on the origin of Satan? In particular, list the five (5) "I wills".
5. Read Jesus' words in Luke 10:18. What does this single verse tell us about Jesus?



6. The above chart was drawn by Clarence Larkin and published in his book, *Rightly Dividing the Word* (1920). Although difficult to read, where do you see the fall of Satan occurring?

7. Mankind's first encounter with Satan was in the Garden of Eden. Let's read Genesis 3 and identify the consequences for the serpent (Satan), women, and men.
