PROPHECIES ABOUT CHRIST’S LIFE		
PROPHECY		FULFILLMENT
Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a Son, and shall call His name Immanuel (Isaiah 7:14).	<b>BORN OF A VIRGIN</b>	After His mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, before they came together, she was found with child of the Holy Spirit (Matthew 1:18).
Out of you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, shall come forth the One to be Ruler in Israel (Micah 5:2).	<b>BORN IN BETHLEHEM</b>	Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea (Matthew 2:1).
The Spirit of the Lord shall rest upon Him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding (Isaiah 11:2).	<b>FAMED FOR WISDOM</b>	Jesus increased in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and men (Luke 2:52).
He had done no violence, nor was any deceit in His mouth (Isaiah 53:9).	<b>LIVED A SINLESS LIFE</b>	Who committed no sin, nor was deceit found in His mouth (1 Peter 2:22).
Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf shall be unstopped. The lame shall leap like a deer (Isaiah 35:5–6).	<b>HEALED THE NEEDY</b>	The blind see and the lame walk; the lepers are cleansed and the deaf hear (Matthew 11:5).
The Lord has anointed Me to preach good tidings to the poor (Isaiah 61:1).	<b>PREACHED GOOD NEWS</b>	The poor have the gospel preached to them (Matthew 11:5).
Shout, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your King is coming to you; lowly and riding on a donkey, a colt, the foal of a donkey (Zechariah 9:9).	<b>ENTERED JERUSALEM IN TRIUMPH</b>	They brought the colt to Jesus, and He sat on it . . . Then those who followed, cried, saying, “Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!” (Mark 11:7–9).

PROPHECY		FULFILLMENT
My own familiar friend in whom I trusted has lifted up his heel against me (Psalm 41:9).	<b>BETRAYED BY A FRIEND</b>	Judas Iscariot, one of the twelve, went to the chief priests to betray Him (Mark 14:10).
They weighed out for my wages thirty pieces of silver (Zechariah 11:12).	<b>SOLD FOR THIRTY PIECES OF SILVER</b>	And they counted out to him thirty pieces of silver (Matthew 26:15).
He was oppressed and He was afflicted, yet He opened not His mouth (Isaiah 53:7).	<b>SILENT WHEN ACCUSED</b>	Pilate asked, “See how many things they testify against You!” But Jesus still answered nothing (Mark 15:4–5).
I gave My back to those who struck Me, and My cheeks to those who plucked out the beard; I did not hide My face from shame and spitting (Isaiah 50:6).	<b>BEATEN AND SPAT UPON</b>	Then some began to spit on Him, and the officers struck Him with the palms of their hands (Mark 14:65).
He was numbered with the transgressors (Isaiah 53:12).	<b>CRUCIFIED WITH SINNERS</b>	With Him they also crucified two robbers (Mark 15:27).
They will look on Me whom they pierced (Zechariah 12:10).	<b>HIS SIDE PIERCED</b>	But one of the soldiers pierced His side with a spear (John 19:34).
He made His grave with the rich at His death (Isaiah 53:9).	<b>BURIED WITH THE RICH</b>	A rich man from Arimathaea, named Joseph, asked for the body of Jesus. Then Joseph laid it in his own new tomb (Matthew 27:57–60).
You will not leave my soul in Sheol, nor will You allow Your Holy One to see corruption (Psalm 16:10).	<b>ROSE FROM THE DEAD</b>	The angel said to them, “You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He is risen!” (Mark 16:6).
You have ascended on high (Psalm 68:18).	<b>ASCENDED INTO HEAVEN</b>	He was received up into heaven (Mark 16:19).
The Lord said to my Lord, “Sit at My right hand” (Psalm 110:1).	<b>EXALTED AT GOD’S RIGHT HAND</b>	Jesus Christ has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God (1 Peter 3:22).
